NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

"Hola, Señor Loco!" means "Hey, Crazy Man!" This Latin salsa groove is intended to sound (and be played) very happy and upbeat. The feel is a simple two-feel with the tempo set where the band can play a comfortable two-feel groove. Feel free to play this chart at a slower tempo if that is where the band sounds more comfortable. The presentation of this chart can easily be enhanced by some band choreography. Consider having the brass sections move back and forth to the beat, and the saxes can move as well and certainly stand for solis. Be creative! Band members, if needed, can play the auxiliary percussion parts. Make the most out of the dynamics at the repeated sections starting at measure 79 by a gradual diminuendo until measure 85. Then hit it hard for a powerful ending. Please enjoy.
