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NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

A swinger all the way, "Indiana" puts the spotlight on the saxophone section. Right from the start, keep the rhythm section locked on the tempo. The tendency is for the brass and saxes to slow down this type of intro. The trombones should swing the background eighths in measure 12. Keep the jazz syllables "doo-dat" in mind to help get the concept across. Also, the trombones can bring out the walk-up line in measures 16 and 17. The sax soli should swing hard, and the saxes should play with drive yet relaxed and not rush the tempo. Observe the accents in the sax soli because they will help lock in the swing feel. As this chart is polished, the saxes will notice that this soli will require concentration to maintain the drive. Check out some recordings of the group Supersax to listen to a sax section that has superb drive. Continue to motivate the saxes with reminders about air support and overall drive and energy. Keep the tempo steady at the end with no ritardando. Please enjoy.
